


- Lovely moments (both public & behind the scenes), more POC, variety of age groups, be as IDIOSYNCRATIC AS YOU WANNA BE!
- The more weird, gross, beautiful, and/or old-timey things you can share, the better!
- Variety: you can start small, with one or two key #brand topics, but plan
  to branch out so things don't get stale, even as you establish reliability
  in certain areas.
- Ask yourself: what's unique about today in my library?
- What are kids & teens making in their programs? How bananas is your bookdrop after a long weekend?

# PHOTO QUALITY

- Take lots & choose the best one
- Square (Mostly)
- Crop
- Fill the frame
- People! Places! Things!
- Use the filters

- Square! (Mostly) Now you can adjust photos to landscape, but square is way more common.
- Be ready to crop!
- Fill the frame!
- People! Places! Things!
- Sharp no blurry garbage
- USE THE FILTERS! They make a huge difference, let you highlight the best in your work, minimize flaws & break up the visual monotony of your posts.


# DON'T DO THIS!



# **Empty Rooms**

#### DON'T DO THIS

- Book displays (unless it's something truly unique/noteworthy)
- Empty rooms
- Blurry photos
- Group shots of people from far away (keep it more close-up, unless it's a HUGE group or you're showing scale)
- People who are in the middle of talking (you end up with weird facial expressions or blurry photos)
- DON'T BE A PEDANTIC JERK / JUDGEY MCJUDGERSON / NEGATIVE NANCY



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- Make sure you describe what's happening in the photo. Is it a program, a candid shot of people using the library, staff members, special collection/weird items you found buried in the stacks?
- Tag other people, for example authors with lots of followers for #bookfacefriday posts.
- If you use an IFTTT recipe to cross-post the IMAGE (not a link to the image) to Twitter, make sure to keep it brief. You can put hashtags in your first comment instead of the caption.

#### HASHTAGS: KEEP IT SIMPLE

• Create one just for your library

EXAMPLE: #chplnj

- Jump on Bandwagons:
  - #MarbledMonday
  - #LibrariesOfInstagram
  - #MayTheFourthBeWithYou
  - #BookBento
- Tips: create one for your library, jump on bandwagons, you can use up to 30, put just a FEW relevant ones in your caption, put the rest in your first (or second) comment
- Search instagram for tag use frequency & use the best/most popular ones: #library (2.5 million) vs. #libraries (75k) (meanwhile, #book and #books are both VERY popular, separated by just a couple million)
- Hashtags help people find you they are searchable on Instagram so it's
   S OK to use a few extremely broad ones like #books, #read, #reading.
   Just make sure they're relevant to the picture you're posting.

## STEAL THIS IDEA!



Off-site pics

Cute animals and/or babies (#caturday)

Memes

Follow libraries on Instagram and be inspired by the work they do!

- It's OK to copy other libraries' ideas no one in your local community will know and they'll all think you're brilliant.
- Libraries will know, but it's not a big deal. Our profession loves to share ideas--for programs, events, PR, etc.
- The same goes for social media post ideas.
- You can tag the library that inspired your post in your comments; it's like a virtual high five.

Anything gross, weird, or SUPER old-timey (everyone loves nostalgia)!

 Is your library home to special collections of any kind? Postcards, posters, photos, knick-knacks, gimcracks, geegaws? Any material culture at all? Take good photos of it - not through glass, not from afar.

#### New perspectives

 If you have a display of work by a local artist (watercolor, photography, quilts, needlepoint), take close-ups, even super-macro detail shots & post them.

### COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT

Geotagging (AKA sharing your location)

Track and use geographically & culturally relevant hashtags

Like & comment with appropriate (borderline wild) enthusiasm

Ask to regram

#### Scheduling

- Afternoons are great (does this even matter?)
- Instagram is busier during the week; more eyes on your perfect, focused, filtered pics.

#### Frequency of posting

- 5-7 times a week, if possible. Minimum of 1-2 times a week.
- One photo per day! Rather than posting multiple photos on one day & then nothing for days, spread out your great pics
- If you don't know where to start, try choosing popular library hashtags
  that are connected to a specific day of the week #marbledmonday,
  #bookfacefriday, #saturdaylibrarian, #throwbackthursday/#tbt,
  #flashbackfriday, etc. You've just created a schedule! Once you get
  more comfortable with posting on Instagram, you can create a more
  varied schedule.



# Shot above from CHPL's April IG schedule Scheduling

- MAKE A SCHEDULE OR SET REMINDERS
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- <u>Later</u> (formerly Latergramme): schedule posts from your desktop!
- Regram: share & give credit to great stuff from other accounts
- StatShot: analytics, free for accounts with up to 5000 followers
- Collage feature: rely on this for more than 1/week collages start to look very samey & lack the visual impact of a single well-composed image
- Connect your other accounts to IG! Currently feasible
  - IFTTT: allows you to post a photo directly to Twitter, rather than part of your caption + a link to the photo - photo posts are more successful on Twitter, anyway, and anything you can do to save your users the hassle of clicking out of the app they're IN is a good thing.
